





High-Risk Alcohol and Opioid Use Among Adults Ages 55 and Older

Data reflect unprecedented increases in high-risk drinking and alcohol use disorders among adults ages 55 and older.

Even if rates remain stable, researchers warn the projected doubling of this population from 2010 to 2030 could create a public health crisis.

Deborah Hasin, M.S., Ph.D., Professor of Epidemiology, Columbia University Medical Center—Dr. Hasin is co-author of a recent study published in *JAMA Psychiatry* on findings from the National Epidemiologic Survey on Alcohol and Related Conditions that indicate significant increases in alcohol use and abuse among older adults.

Frederic Blow, Ph.D., Professor and Director of the Addiction Center, Department of Psychiatry, University of Michigan—Dr. Blow is a national expert on substance abuse, including substance abuse prevention, screening, and diagnosis for older adults.








Substance Use/Misuse Logic Model Older Adults

Michigan Older Adult Logic Model

Alcohol and Other Drug (AOD)-Related Consequences



Problem Behaviors



Intervening Variables

Injuries due to falls
Cognitive impairment

Motor vehicle crashes

Adverse interactions with medications, including overdose deaths

Complicated management of health problems

Increase in ER visits

Suicides

Abuse and financial exploitation

High-risk drinking & alcohol use disorders

Misuse of prescription opioids and BZDs

Biological changes that reduce ability to absorb and metabolize alcohol

Grief and loss due to death of loved ones and friends

History of drug use

Social isolation and depression

Financial issues and poverty related to decrease in income and unemployment

Stressful events and transitions (e.g., changes in housing)

Diminishing health and physical disabilities

Multiple prescribed medications

Stigma associated with mental health and substance use

Traumatic experiences (PTSD, ACEs)

Culture of prescribing opioids for pain management

Cultural context associated with AOD use
